Online Dual Enrollment
Student/Parent Agreement Form

The online courses will be offered through the Tennessee Technology Center
@ Elizabethton.

- **Spring 2012** courses will begin **January 9, 2012** and end **April 18, 2012**. The deadline to drop a class is **January 27, 2012**. Otherwise, the student will receive a failing grade and will not qualify for future funding of dual enrollment classes.
- Attendance will be monitored by the Instructor of the course. The student will be required to log in to the online classes minimally 2-3 x per week and to email the instructor minimally one time a week. The student can be dropped from the class if he/she fails to log in to the class within a 2 week time-frame.
- Unit tests and final Exams will be proctored by the instructor and or designated individual. Students will provide their own transportation to and from the TTC location, unless otherwise specified.
- All students are assigned an **ORIENTATION & SAFETY Online Class** that they must complete before they can receive credit for their Dual Enrollment Class. We ask that the student complete this class before starting the online class.
- Students passing the PN Dual Enrollment Courses with an 81 average will be eligible to receive course credit in the Practical Nursing Program at TTC Elizabethton. Students that desire to enroll in Practical Nursing Program at TTC Elizabethton must first pass the program's admission test and will at that time be eligible for enrollment in the next available Practical Nursing class. Credit for course work completed in the dual enrollment **Trends and Issues in Nursing**, **Medical Terminology**, and **Dosage Calculations for Nurses** will be awarded at that admission.
- Students completing the BST, CIT, or Drafting & CAD online courses will be eligible to receive course credit in those programs at any TTC in the state, upon enrollment into the program.
- To be eligible for a dual enrollment grant for any semester beyond the first semester of receipt, the student must achieve a grade average of "C" for all postsecondary courses attempted while participating in the Dual Enrollment Grant program

To Qualify:

- Currently be a **Junior or Senior** at the time the courses begin
- ACT score of 19 **or** recommendation from CTE Director, principal, or counselor.
- Applicant must be highly self-disciplined, motivated, and with no attendance/disciplinary issues in order to be considered.
- Tuition/fees for one credit course (up to 135 hours) will be paid through Dual Enrollment Grant funds for qualifying applicants.
 - Students interested in taking more than 135 hours will need to secure funding from other sources (private, school system, other grants, etc)
- Textbooks will need to be purchased by the school, the individual student, or other.
